Initial Assessment and Referral (IAR) for mental health care – Older adult version

Part one of the workshop provides the background and orientation to stepped care, the initial assessment and referral process, and the decision support tool. In part two of the workshop, participants engage in practical activity focusing on applying the IAR decision support tool to the prepared scenario. This session is tailored to patients who are older adults.

The high risk foot

An informative session, aimed at providing insights into how to identify a high risk foot and the best-practice to manage the condition. A high risk foot is characterised by diminished sensation, compromised vascular supply, and potentially significant deformities. Which elevate the risk of developing wounds or ulcers, often leading to serious complications. Individuals with diabetes are particularly susceptible, representing the largest group affected by high risk foot issues.

Palliative Care ECHO is a series of interactive case-based virtual mentoring sessions that address a range of palliative care topics. Discussion of deidentified patient cases and 10-minute lectures aim to increase palliative care knowledge, skills and confidence in primary healthcare professionals. This session is part 2 on the topic of psychosocial clinical pain management.

Project ECHO (Extension for Community Health Outcomes) is a virtual knowledge-sharing network designed to create a 'learning loop' between health professionals with the aim of increasing knowledge and access to health care in local communities
