Initial Assessment and Referral (IAR) for mental healthcare – adolescent version Webinar

Monday 7 April 6.30-8.30pm

The National IAR Guidance and IAR Decision Support Tool (IAR-DST) was developed by the Australian Department of Health and Aged Care. The IAR training will run for two hours and focus on:

- Introduction to IAR and the development of the National Guidance.
- Orientation to the domains, levels of care, and decision support tool
- Clinical judgement and supported decision-making.
- Application of the IAR in assessment and intake settings (practical activity using a case vignette).
- Discussion around local and national Mental Health services, including the newly released HealthPathways pages.

Part one of the workshop providers the background and orientation to stepped care, the initial assessment and referral process, and the decision support tool. In part two of the workshop, participants engage in practical activity focusing on applying the IAR decision support tool to the prepared scenario.

This session on the IAR is tailored to adolescents.

Initial Assessment and Referral (IAR) for mental healthcare – older adult version Webinar Wednesday 9 April

This session on the IAR is tailored to older adults. The National IAR Guidance and IAR Decision Support Tool (IAR-DST) was developed by the Australian Department of Health and Aged Care and is designed to provide:

- Advice relating to initial assessment and intake (the eight holistic assessment domains).
- A description of evidence-based services by level of intensity (the five levels of care).
- Criteria to assist with matching an individual to a level of care that is most likely to meet the individual's treatment needs and recovery goals (the IAR-DST).

Part one of the workshop providers the background and orientation to stepped care, the initial assessment and referral process, and the decision support tool. In part two of the workshop, participants engage in practical activity focusing on applying the IAR decision support tool to the prepared scenario.

Tasmania Residential Aged Care Enhanced Response (TRACER) update for GP's

Webinar

Thursday 10 April

7-8pm

TRACER is the Tasmanian Residential Aged Care Enhanced Response pathway to connect 000 calls triaged by Ambulance Tasmania (AT) as non-urgent, from Residential Aged Care Homes directly to the AT Clinical Hub for virtual clinical assessment.

Where appropriate, referral will be made to enable care to be provided in Residential Aged Care Homes and avoid unnecessary transport to the Emergency Department or retriaged in priority for ambulance response reflecting the resident's needs.

Representatives from the Ambulance Tasmania TRACER project team will be providing information on TRACER, and how it will support care in Tasmanian Residential Aged Care Homes.

General Practitioners Behaviours and end of life care with dementia

Webinar

Wednesday 30 April

7-8pm

Primary palliative care is a fundamental aspect of high-quality care for patients with a serious illness such as dementia. Join the expert medical education team at Dementia Training Australia for a webinar that will help GPs who care for dementia patients recognise prognostic indicators for the end-of-life stage and outline the importance of reviewing and rationalising interventions in line individual goals of care.

The webinar will also examine the importance of a personcentred approach.

Lastly, the webinar will highlight how communication at endof-life can impact bereavement and how GPs can support caregivers in relation to grief and bereavement as they are in a unique position to initiate such discussions.

The webinar is aimed at GPs but is inclusive of general practice nurses and other professionals with an interest in this topic.
